
BTS/NICE/SIGN 2024 Guidelines (NG245) for the pharmacological management of asthma in people aged 12 years and older¹



- *As stated by Asthma + Lung UK: the use of as needed ICS/Formoterol may be suitable for patients where any one of the following apply:²
- 1. Asthma symptoms present occasionally (e.g less than twice a month)
- 2. Only need managing asthma at certain times of the year e.g. pollen season
- 3. If occasional allergens trigger asthma symptoms, or
- 4. Need help managing symptoms when exercising

Uncontrolled asthma: Any exacerbation requiring oral corticosteroids or frequent regular symptoms (such as using reliever inhaler 3 or more days a week or nighttime waking 1 or more times a week)¹

Existing diagnosis of asthma on the treatment pathway recommended by previous NICE and BTS/SIGN guidelines¹

Fobumix Easyhaler® Indication:

Asthma: Regular treatment of asthma where the use of a combination (inhaled corticosteroid and long-acting beta-2-adrenoceptor agonist) is appropriate: patients not adequately controlled with inhaled corticosteroids and "as needed" inhaled short-acting beta-2-adrenoceptor agonists or patients already adequately controlled on both inhaled corticosteroids and long-acting beta-2-adrenoceptor agonists.

Fobumix Easyhaler® 80/4.5mcg: indicated for maintenance therapy in patients ≥6 years of age, and MART in patients ≥12 years of age.

Fobumix Easyhaler® 160/4.5mcg: indicated for reliever therapy (as-needed, AIR) in mild asthma, maintenance therapy and MART in patients ≥12 years of age.

Fobumix Easyhaler® 320/9mcg: indicated for maintenance therapy only in patients ≥12 years of age.

Note: Fobumix Easyhaler® 80/4.5mcg is not appropriate in patients with severe asthma.
